
Town Highway News

Article 1219 of the New York Vehicle Traffic law prohibits plowing, shoveling or blowing of snow into a street or highway. This law also covers other items likely to pose a hazard to motorists including glass, nails, wire, cans, etc. Fines for a first offense include up to a \$150 fine and/or 15 days in jail plus applicable surcharges.

This law also stipulates that anyone that places or permits to be placed upon any highway any material which interferes with the safe use of the highway shall immediately remove the same or cause it to be removed. This includes SNOW! If you are a homeowner and you hire a person to plow your driveway, and you permit him/her to plow snow into the road, you could be cited under this law.

The town highway dept asks that you respect the law as laid out above. This is for the safety of all. Compliance makes it easier for everyone concerned.

In addition, if you're walking or jogging along our roadways in the dark, please wear reflective clothing so you can be seen by passing cars. Wear bright colors when walking in the daytime. When walking at night, wear light-colored clothing and reflective clothing or a reflective vest to be visible. Drivers are often not expecting walkers to be out after dark, and you need to give them every chance to see you, even at street crossings that have crossing signals.
