Elections are coming up November 5th for many Onondaga County positions including Tully Town Supervisor and Town Board. This year for the first time in New York, voters can vote early. Here is a list of early voting dates and places where you can vote early.

Early Voting in New York State will begin prior to the November 5th General Election. The early voting period will be from: Saturday, October 26, 2019 through Sunday, November 3, 2019.

### **Village of Tully News**

The Village of Tully is now registered as a Climate Smart Community in New York State, joining almost three hundred other municipalities. The Resolution passed by the Board adapted the Climate Smart Communities pledge in order to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and adapt to a changing climate. The pledge is comprised of the following elements:

- Build a climate-smart community.
- 2. Inventory emissions, set goals, and plan for climate actions.
- Decrease energy use.
- 4. Shift to clean, renewable energy.
- 5. Use climate-smart materials management.
- 6. Implement climate-smart land use.
- 7. Enhance community resilience to climate change.
- 8. Support a green innovation economy.
- 9. Inform and inspire the public.
- 10. Engage in an evolving process of climate action.

The Village has already begun moving toward some of these goals by installing LED street lights and benchmarking energy use in our largest facilities at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

The Village Board continues to be proactive in finding ways to save on energy and protect our environmental and economic resources.

#### **Train Station**

In 2008 the Train Station renovation began and over the past six years it has been available to be rented for events . Prior to that while renovation continued, usage was by donation. It is rewarding to have the community make use of this restored building. There are two major updates the Train Station is in need of: The Roof needs replacing; and the floor in the front section of the Station needs to be removed , along with the subfloor and floor joists, and then concrete poured. These are both very costly updates. Although financial assistance through grants is being pursued, public donations of any amount are also needed.

The Tully Area Historical Society administers the use of this building. Your consideration in making a donation to the "Fix the Station" fund is much appreciated. Keep in mind this historic building makes an excellent venue for a variety of events: Birthday parties, bridal or baby showers, family gatherings, class reunions, organization events, or business conferences. "Songs for a Winter's Night" and "Christmas at The Station" are two large annual events held there. Help preserve this historic building for all to use.

The Tully Joint Fire District was recently awarded a FEMA AFG grant for \$18,912.38. We also received a matching fund grant from the D.E.C. for \$1,500.00. These monies will be used to purchase Fire Hose, Nozzles, and Wild Land Fire Gear. Additional funding was made by Onondaga County Legislator Chairman David Knapp. He was able to award the District approximately \$10,000.00 which will be used to purchase a Thermal Imaging Camera. We are grateful to all agencies involved that made this possible to lessen the Tax burden for the Tully Community... We Thank You! Fire Chief Frank Speziale.

I have included pie charts related to our 2019 taxes. This offers no new information from what is on your tax bill, but, this format may offer a much more concise way to visualize where our taxes go. Every citizen has the right (and the obligation) to be aware of where their money goes and have a say in monitoring wasteful spending.

I hope this format offers perspective and helps you understand the accountability for your overall tax situation. (Please note trash is not included.)

We just moved our 2020 budget work to "preliminary" status. I would like to thank our Board members, and all those involved, for doing their best to hold the line on spending. There will be a Public Hearing on the budget Nov 7th,2019 at 6:30 PM.

Other Board activities this month:

•The Board has been working with Cranesville Block. They are the current owners and operators of the Tully Gravel


Mine site. In 2005, they bought Clark Concrete, thereby accepting the former owners legal liabilities. Our goal is to ensure that they are meeting the terms for reclamation.


- •The Town will be appointing a Fire commissioner. We are soliciting interested parties to apply.
- •Brian Ramsey, our lead Ambulance person, (Fire Captain) is retiring. Effective Nov.4th, the Board has appointed Chad Wakula to assume this position. In the mean time, Chad

will be job shadowing Brian, to ensure a smooth transition. I want to thank Brian for his service. I have on more than one occasion needed the Ambulance at my home and it was always reassuring to see Brian and his team. Thank You!

Several minor maintenance improvements have been made to the Tully Town Hall Building. They will include new doors installed on the rear of the building and Access ramps to the pavilion.

The Town is working with Town Historian, Nancy Chawgo, to research alternate forms of funding for the "on going" renovation of the Tully Train Station.

This grant is to help businesses improve aesthetics, business creation and retention, and beautification projects. The goal is to create a more healthy and economically vibrant community.

Improvement examples include:

- Acquiring properties that have become eyesores
- Demolition of eyesore properties
- Streetscape improvements
