Town of Tully Clean-up Day—Saturday, May14, 2016

The clean-up day is ONLY for Village of Tully and Town of Tully residents. You must show proof of residency and accompany vehicle at drop-off site. Proof of residency must have your street address on it. A Post Office Box will not be accepted as proof of residency.

All items must be less than 10 feet in length. All oil, gas and antifreeze products, which are not acceptable for disposal, must be drained from tanks and equipment.

IF YOU HAVE UNACCETABLE ITEMS ON BOARD, YOU WILL **NOT BE ALLOWED ON SITE!**

What WILL be accepted

Most general rubbish, appliances, metal, computers (flat screen monitors only, no CRTs), electronics, lawn & garden waste, vehicle batteries, empty drums and pails cut in half. Tires will be accepted off the rim at a cost (prices subject to change). Please have the correct amount of money, 16 inch and smaller tires: \$3. 17-inch and larger truck tires: \$7. Large tires: \$25

What will NOT be accepted

Rechargeable or disposable household batteries, florescent tubes, brush, garbage, TELEVISIONS, recyclables, pails with lids, whole drums, paints, chemicals, oil, gas, antifreeze or any hazardous waste.

Please separate items to improve efficiency at disposal site.

Drop off station 1—Tires, vehicle batteries, empty propane tanks, computer monitors, keyboards, microwaves and major electronic components.

Drop off station 2— General Rubbish

Drop off station 3—All metals & appliances (except refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers and humidifiers).

Drop off station 4-refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, humidifiers, box springs & mattresses.

Drop off station 5—Lawn and garden waste

Tully has a new Eagle Scout

Anthony Velonis has been in the scouting program for twelve of his seventeen years. A Scout must earn 21 Merit Badges to achieve the Eagle rank. Anthony earned 29, including Communications, Citizenship in the Community, Citizenship in the Nation and Citizenship in the World. An Eagle candidate must serve six months in a position of responsibility in his Troop. Anthony served for 24 months. He was also elected to the Order of the Arrow which is Scouting's Honor Society and participated in National Youth Leadership Training. In his own words, he said "I'm in Scouting for two reasons: first, to improve my leadership

skills, and second, to show other Scouts the right way." He has done just that, dedicating much of his time to teaching the younger Scouts.

His Eagle service project consisted of designing, building and installing bat houses at Morgan Hill State Forest under the auspices of the Department of Environmental Conservation. Anthony is very optimistic that the bat houses will assist this helpful and interesting animal recover from the environmental stress under which it currently suffers.



Now accepting applications for Parks and Recreations Supervisor

After eleven years of outstanding service to the community, Jayne Morse, is stepping down as Town of Tully Parks and Recreations supervisor. Applications are being accepted immediately and may be in the form of a resume. They may be mailed to the following address:

The position will officially be open May 1, 2016. Interviews will be conducted by one Parks and Recreation volunteer, Head of the Park and Rec and one town board member.

The work involves responsibility for organizing and implementing one or more major segments of a recreation program. Under the general supervision of a Director of Recreation or the administrator of a recreation program, an employee plans, organizes and implements one or more types of recreational activities, such as arts and crafts, athletics, dances, cultural events and so on. Program planning is done in conjunction with the director/administrator and is incorporated within the comprehensive program. Organization and implementation are performed with wide latitude for independent action. Depending upon the size of the total program or an incumbent's particular assignment, the Recreation Supervisor may participate as a leader in specific activities and may supervise subordinate personnel. Work is reviewed by the director/administrator through written and oral reports and evaluation of community acceptance of the programs. The position differs from that of Assistant Director of Recreation in the scope of responsibilities; the latter directly assists in the performance and completion of all director's activities.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- A) Graduation from a regionally accredited college or university or one accredited by the New York State Board of Regents to grant degrees with a Bachelor's Degree or higher with a minimum of fifteen (15) semester credit hours in recreation courses; or,
- B) Graduation from a regionally accredited college or university or one accredited by the New York State Board of Regents to grant degrees with a Bachelor's Degree or higher and one (1) year of full-time work experience, or its part-time equivalent, in the conduct of recreation activities involving personal responsibility for the initiation but not necessarily the planning, design or development of day-to-day recreation activities at a site such as a park, playground or an after school program; or,
- C) Four (4) years of full-time work experience, or its part time equivalent, in the conduct of recreation activities, at least two (2) years of which must have been work experience involving personal responsibility for the initiation but not necessarily the planning, design or development of day to day recreation activities at a site such as a park, playground or an after school program; or,
- D) An equivalent combination of training and experience as defined by the limits of (a), (b) and (c) above.
