Tully Citizen of the Year



Years ago, Kathy served on as an EMT for the ambulance service, answering calls at all hours of the night and taking care of her friends and neighbors in Tully.

While teaching Chemistry at Tully HS, she also offered up her own house for walking field trips so that kids could learn about biology and gardening. She also has acted as a voluntary advocate for people in the community as they go on doctors appointments, helping them with asking the right questions and understanding their own medical process. In addition she drives the elderly and those in need of a ride to appointments, and spends her own time getting fresh foods from the food bank and delivering it to needy families in Tully. Kathy started the Tully Community Garden, and continues each year to organize a volunteer pool of about 12 each year. She spends hundreds of hours each summer sowing, weeding, and tending the garden, and organizes

the delivery as well as pays for the mulch herself. She also founded the Tully Area TimeBank, which as of today has exchanged over 300 hours of time across 38 members. She continues to act as a coordinator for the Timebank, organizing potlucks and making sure the website is in working order. She has organized many speaking presentations for folks in the community on a variety of topics, including Alzheimer's in the family and weight loss in older populations. She also has hosted "Slideshow Parties" at her home, where she takes guests through her travels in other places and gives them a chance to see potential places they might wish to travel.

As a philanthropist, Kathy has donated thousands of dollars towards the different organizations and groups in Tully. She helped purchase and rehab the old ski shop into a grocery store, has donated to T.A.G. for the new park, and has donated to other groups, including the Tully Arts Council. In addition, she has helped fellow small business owners with start up funds and advice from a

veteran business owner. She also donated funds to purchase a new Chemistry lab at SUNY Cortland a few years back. She remains an active donor to SUNY Cortland.

While it may not be mentioned as she does earn a small salary, Kathy has also been an active Village Trustee for many years. She goes above and beyond her pay grade by writing grants, assisting with the website, and taking additional classes which can aid her in her goals of creating a more sustainable community. She does more than she is asked and is a valuable member of the Village Board.

Kathy's endless dedication to bringing life and new ideas into the community shines through whenever you speak to her. She has energy that never seems to run out, and is always willing to help out a friend or neighbor. She absolutely deserves to be recognized for all of her time and efforts to make Tully a nicer place to live. The Tully Artworks Studio, the town's gallery and arts center, is currently under repair and renovation until Monday, May 28th [Memorial Day] when it will reopen with a number of additions, including new furniture, upgraded display space, an internal box office for events, upgraded lights/sound for fine art displays and performing art, and a Chocolate Bar at which delicious treats, baked goods, and a variety of hot and cold drinks can be purchased. All of these confections are the work of local culinary artists, and, because the Tully Arts Council which owns the studio is a not-for-profit organization, the profits earned from sales will be given to those artists, whose volunteer work has made the Arts Council events delicious in many ways for many years.

The grand re-opening will begin at 8 a.m. when Artworks will hand out free American flags in front of the building at 5 Elm Street [the former Encore Video] for waving during the parade, as well as free samples of yummy treats and coffee. CULINARY ARTS EDUCATION MAKES FOR DELICIOUS EVENTS

The Tully Arts Council proudly announces the debut of a new program that should make people who like making and eating delicious food from around the world very happy.

On Saturday, June 2nd, the first in a series of food classes, demonstrations, and dinner events will take place at the Tully United Community Church, sponsored by the local not-for-profit arts organization in collaboration with Syracuse-based restaurant With Love, an extension of the Masters of Culinary Arts program at Onondaga Community College.

Guest Chef Venus Likulumbi, whose culinary roots are in the American South, Congo, and the Philippines, will bring down-home cooking with a touch of foreign zest to two events at the Community Church—a Create Your Own Curry demonstration and sampler for adventurous chefs at 12 PM, and a scrumptious Southern-style sit-down dinner at 6:30 PM with music, candlelight, and a brief chat afterwards about her inspirations and suggestions for invigorating cuisine.

Culinary art has been a part of the Arts Council's mission from the very beginning, from the pastry-filled intermission cabaret during performances of the council's first musical, Godspell, in 2003, to the story-themed refreshments at intermission during Mary Poppins last summer. This year the culinary arts program is expanding both in the ArtWorks gallery and around the town, and you are invited to be a part of it! This day of food events is the first in the program, and is being offered at a special price.

12 PM-1 PM—Create Your Own Curry Demonstration and Sampler

People often assume curry powder is one ground-up spice, but it's actually not, it's a mixture of different spices that can be combined in various types of dishes that are familiar across Asia, southern Europe, Latin America, the Caribbean Islands and all over the world. Learn about the components of this classic style of cooking that has many different colors, styles, ingredients, and tastes, depending on how you season it! Participants will leave with a basket of food components, including the curry powder they have blended and mixed themselves, as well as recipes for many different styles of

the dish to make with those components.

with Jasmine Rice will be enjoyed at the end.
