7:15PM PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER THE APPLICATION OF REED DOODY REQUESTING SPECIAL AUTHORIZATION FROM THE TOWN BOARD FOR THE INSTALLATION OF A WIND TURBINE

Supervisor Lund asked the town clerk to read the notice of public hearing.

Mrs. Vaccaro read from the notice as follows: "a Public Hearing will be held by the Town Board... on the 10th day of June, 2015 at 7:15pm to consider the following: The application of Reed Doody, 986 Stevens Road, Tully, New York, requesting Special Authorization from the Town Board for the installation of a 10kw, 133.5' wind turbine pursuant to Town Code Section 280-11.1. The subject parcel is identified as Tax Map 117.-02-01.00 and located within an Agricultural-2 Zoning District. This application is open to inspection at the office of the Town of Tully Clerk at 5833 Meetinghouse Road, Tully, New York during the Town Clerk's published regular business hours."

Reed Doody spoke to the board regarding the need for the height of 133.5 feet. There are greater wind speeds at that height to produce a greater output. Mr. Primo explained the code requirements for this type of application. He also reviewed the issues that the planning board had concerns about, and a lengthy discussion followed with questions and comments including the fall distance of the total structure onto adjoining property, noise pollution, a proposed maintenance schedule, removal of the structure if not operating for a period of time, and possible liability of the town for any accidents that may occur. Also discussed were neighbors and whether they were okay with the project. John McMahon submitted a letter to the board with his concerns which were also briefly reviewed.

Motion to close the Public Hearing at 8:40pm was made, seconded and carried unanimously by
