Update from Supervisor Masters

Last month, I tried to update everyone on requests for "Speed limit" changes. I have finally received a response from the State DOT. My request was to change each of the requested roads to 35 MPH. The State's response was as follows:

Wetmore Rd 45 MPH

Lake Rd 45 MPH (Some of Lake rd. was already at 45

MPH)

Gatehouse Rd 35 MPH

Long Rd "Reduction in speed not appropriate"

I know these are disappointing results for some of the interested parties. I did ask if these could be re-evaluated and was told that generally that it "would not be appropriate and is not done within three years of original review." At this point, the State DOT will submit this information to Albany. The Town has to await an "authorization" letter before we can update postings.

I am happy to announce that we have been able to complete the roof replacement on our "historic" train station. Thanks again to the Village and Dave Knapp for procuring funding.

The Tully and Lafayette Town Boards, along with OCWA and Honeywell, are working towards finalizing the agreements for the Rt11A and Cardiff water districts. We hope this will be accomplished by the end of Oct. 2021.

Our "Tully Trash Day" was Oct. 9th. Thanks to our Town Clerk, Sue Vaccaro, we were able to add document shredding services. The shredding truck was located in the Town Hall parking area. This was very well received and something we hope to continue in the future.

The Town Board has been working on the 2022 Town Budget. The Public hearing is scheduled for 11/3/21 at 7:30 PM.

Honeywell/Fellows Falls Property

Below is current information from NYSDEC as they complete their evaluation and due diligence for public access to this property, all which must be completed by March 2022. We look forward to Spring!

The Trustees (NYSDEC and USFWS) are continuing to evaluate options for land ownership and management, as defined in the Consent Decree.

Several field visits to the property have occurred.

A land survey was completed in cooperation with DEC Real Property, and is being reviewed/processed.

DEC Mineral Resources conducted an assessment of past brine well closure activities on the property.

Discussions are ongoing about appropriate public access and recreation such as fishing, hunting, hiking, and other uses.

At this time, the property is still owned by Honeywell and access remains restricted. The Trustees were notified in February 2021 of a third party's interest. We are working with the third party to see if it is a viable option. There is a lot to work through on this option and the fallback option is DEC ownership. The decision deadline is March 2022. We'll have more information for you then. Either way this plays out, we expect public access to the falls as we have discussed in the past
