## **Town Highway News**


With the winter season fast approaching, please remember the parking rules and laws that are in place for the Village, Town, and State.

There is no parking from 2am—6am on all roads from November 1st to April 1st in the village of Tully. This is for your and your cars's safety.

Article 1219 of the New York Vehicle Traffic law prohibits plowing, shoveling, or blowing of snow into a street or highway. This law also covers other items likely to pose a hazard to motorists including glass, nails, wire, cans, etc. Fines for a first offense include up to a \$150 fine and/or 15 days in jail, plus applicable surcharges.

This law also stipulates that anyone that places or permits to be placed upon any highway any material which interferes with the safe use of the highway shall immediately remove the sum or cause it to be removed. This includes SNOW! If you are a homeowner and you hire a person to plow your driveway, and you permit him/her to plow snow into the road, you could be cited under this law.
